Paired-domination in generalized claw-free graphs

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Abstract

In this paper, we continue the study of paired-domination in graphs introduced by Haynes and Slater (Networks 32 (1998) 199–206). A set S of vertices in a graph Gis a paired-dominating set of G if every vertex of G is adjacent to some vertex in Sand if the subgraph induced by S contains a perfect matching. The paired-domination number of G, denoted by $\gamma_{\rm pr}(G)$, is the minimum cardinality of a paired-dominating set of G. If G does not contain a graph F as an induced subgraph, then G is said to be F-free. Haynes and Slater (Networks 32 (1998) 199–206) showed that if G is a connected graph of order $n \geq 3$, then $\gamma_{\rm pr}(G) \leq n-1$ and this bound is sharp for graphs of arbitrarily large order. Every graph is $K_{1,a+2}$ -free for some integer $a \geq 0$. We show that for every integer $a \geq 0$, if G is a connected $K_{1,a+2}$ -free graph of order $n \geq 2$, then $\gamma_{\rm pr}(G) \leq 2(an + 1)/(2a + 1)$ with infinitely many extremal graphs.

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
