## Exercise 1

Determine the chromatic index of a complete graph on $n$ vertices.

## Exercise 2

Let $d$ be an integer. Let $G$ be a $d$-regular $d$-edge-colorable graph. Let $e$ be an edge of $G$ and let $G^{\prime}$ be the graph obtained from $G$ by subdividing the edge $e$. Prove that $G^{\prime}$ is class II, i.e., $\chi^{\prime}\left(G^{\prime}\right)=\Delta\left(G^{\prime}\right)+1$.

## Exercise 3

Determine the choosability of a cycle on $n$ vertices.

## Exercise 4

Prove that the only list assignment $L$ of an odd cycle $C$ with lists of size two such that $C$ is not $L$-colorable is the one where all the lists are equal.

## Exercise 5

Let $k$ be an integer. Find an example of a bipartite graph that is not $k$-choosable.

## Exercise 6

1. Let $G_{0}$ be the plane graph with six vertices $v_{1}, \ldots, v_{6}$ and 12 edges, obtained from a cycle $v_{1} v_{2} \cdots v_{6}$ by adding three diagonals joining odd vertices inside the cycle and adding three diagonals joining even vertices outside the cycle.
Find a list assignment $L_{0}$ of $G_{0}$ such that $\left|L\left(v_{i}\right)\right|=4$ for the three inner vertices ( $i$ odd) and $\left|L\left(v_{i}\right)\right|=1$ for the three outer vertices ( $i$ even) such that $G_{0}$ is not $L_{0}$-colorable.
2. Let $G$ be a plane graph obtained from two copies of $G_{0}$ by identifying one edge incident to the outer face from each copy. Observe that $G$ has 10 vertices and 23 edges; its outer face is of size four.
Find a list assignment $L_{1}$ of $G_{1}$ such that the two vertices of degree four incident to the outer face receive lists of size one, whereas all the other vertices (including the two vertices of degree seven) receive lists of size four, such that $G_{1}$ is not $L_{1}$-colorable.
3. Using several copies of the graph $G_{1}$ as gadgets, find a plane graph $G_{2}$ and a list assignment $L_{2}$ of $G_{2}$ such that two vertices incident to the outer face of $G_{2}$ receive lists of size three, all the other vertices receive lists of size four, and $G_{2}$ is not $L_{2}$-colorable.
4. Use several copies of the graph $G_{2}$ as building blocks, find a plane graph $G$ and a list assigment $L$ of $G$ with all the lists of size four, such that $G$ is not $L$-colorable - hence find a planar graph that is not 4-choosable. What is its size?
