Vertex coloring of Line graphs.



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 $\Delta \leq \chi' \leq \chi'_\ell \leq 2\Delta - 1.$

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Theorem (Beineke '70)

Characterized by nine forbidden induced subgraphs.

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For any graph, $\chi'_{\ell} = \chi'$.

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Asymptotically true:

Theorem (Kahn '93)

 $\chi'_{\ell} - \chi' = o(\chi')$ when $\chi' \to \infty$.

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Theorem (Galvin '95)

For any bipartite graph, $\chi'_{\ell} = \chi'$.

Theorem (Vizing '64)

For any graph, $\Delta \leq \chi' \leq \Delta + 1$.

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Theorem (Sanders Zhao '01)

For any planar graph with $\Delta \geq 7$, $\chi' = \Delta$.

Theorem (Borodin '90)

For any planar graph with $\Delta \ge 12$, $\chi'_{\ell} = \Delta$.

Theorem (Li Xu '11)

For any planar graph with
$$\Delta \geq 8$$
 and without on nor $\chi'_{\ell} = \Delta$, $\chi''_{\ell} = \Delta + 1$.

Theorem

For any planar graph with $\Delta \geq 7$ and without on or $\lambda_{\ell}' = \Delta$, $\chi_{\ell}'' = \Delta + 1$.
