VASS Extended with Tests, Resets and Transfers

• $\Delta \subseteq Q \times \Sigma \times Q$: finite set of transitions

Configurations: $q(\mathbf{x})$ with $q \in Q$ and $\mathbf{x} \in \mathbb{N}^d$

$$\begin{array}{ll} (a_1,a_2)\in\mathbb{Z}^2 & \text{ stands for } & (c_1,c_2)\leftarrow(c_1+a_1,c_2+a_2)\\ T(1) & c_1==0\\ R(2) & c_2\leftarrow 0\\ Tr(1,2) & c_2\leftarrow c_2+c_1 \ ; \ c_1\leftarrow 0 \end{array}$$

REACHABILITY Instance: an EVASS and two configurations $p(\mathbf{x})$, $q(\mathbf{y})$. Question: is $p(\mathbf{x}) \xrightarrow{*} q(\mathbf{y})$?

COVERABILITY

Instance: an EVASS and two configurations $p(\mathbf{x})$, $q(\mathbf{y})$. Question: is $p(\mathbf{x}) \xrightarrow{*} q(\mathbf{z})$ for some $\mathbf{z} \ge \mathbf{y}$?

BOUNDEDNESS Instance: an EVASS and a configuration $p(\mathbf{x})$. Question: is $\{q(\mathbf{y}) \mid p(\mathbf{x}) \xrightarrow{*} q(\mathbf{y})\}$ finite ?

 - decidability status of reachability, coverability, termination and deadlock-freedom [Akshay, Chakraborty, Das, Jagannath, Sandeep 2017]

A Crucial Observation on Runs of TRVASS



Decomposition of runs from p in the example:

$$p(x_{\text{init}}, y_{\text{init}}) \xrightarrow{\mathbf{A}^*} \xrightarrow{T} r(0, y_1) \xrightarrow{\mathbf{A}^*} \xrightarrow{R} p(x_2, 0) \xrightarrow{\mathbf{A}^*} \xrightarrow{T} r(0, y_3) \cdots$$

A Crucial Observation on Runs of TRVASS



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Decomposition of runs in general:

$$c_{\text{init}} \xrightarrow{\mathbf{A}^*} \xrightarrow{T|R} c_1 \xrightarrow{\mathbf{A}^*} \xrightarrow{T|R} c_2 \cdots \xrightarrow{\mathbf{A}^*} \xrightarrow{T|R} c_k \xrightarrow{\mathbf{A}^*} c_{\text{final}}$$

where at least one counter is zero in c_i

Presburger (One-Counter) Automata



Configurations: q(x) with $q \in Q$ and $x \in \mathbb{N}$

Steps:

$$p(x) \rightarrow q(y)$$
 iff $\exists (p \xrightarrow{S} q) \in \Delta : (x, y) \in S$

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A Reachability is undecidable for Presburger automata in general

Diagonal Presburger-Definable Relations

Definition

A relation $S \subseteq \mathbb{N} \times \mathbb{N}$ is diagonal if

$$x S y \Rightarrow (x+c) S (y+c)$$



$$\underbrace{p(0,m) \xrightarrow{A^*T} q(0,n)}_{S_{TT}} \text{ and } \underbrace{p(m,0) \xrightarrow{A^*R} q(n,0)}_{S_{RR}} \text{ are diagonal}$$

Theorem

Diagonal Presburger-definable relations are effectively closed under union, intersection, composition and transitive closure.

Diagonal Presburger-Definable Relations — Example

$$\begin{array}{ll} x \, S \, y & \stackrel{\mathrm{def}}{\Leftrightarrow} & x \leq y \ \land \ y \leq 2x \\ x \, S^+ \, y & \Leftrightarrow & x \leq y \ \land \ (x = 0 \Leftrightarrow y = 0) \end{array}$$





Diagonal Presburger-Definable Relations — Proof

$$I_{S} = \{x \mid \exists y > x : x \, S \, y\} \qquad D_{S} = \{y \mid \exists x > y : x \, S \, y\}$$

$$\alpha = \min\{\delta > 0 \mid \forall x \in I_S : (x, x + \delta) \in S\}$$
(0 if $I_S = \emptyset$)
$$\beta = \min\{\delta > 0 \mid \forall y \in D_S : (y + \delta, y) \in S\}$$
(0 if $D_S = \emptyset$)

$$\begin{aligned} & \operatorname{Inc}_{\mathcal{S}}(x,y) \stackrel{\text{def}}{\Leftrightarrow} (x=y) \lor (x \in I_{\mathcal{S}} \land y \in x + \mathbb{N}\alpha) \\ & \operatorname{Dec}_{\mathcal{S}}(x,y) \stackrel{\text{def}}{\Leftrightarrow} (x=y) \lor (y \in D_{\mathcal{S}} \land x \in y + \mathbb{N}\beta) \end{aligned}$$

Lemma

If $S \subseteq \mathbb{N} \times \mathbb{N}$ is diagonal then $S^+ = \operatorname{Inc}_S \cdot (S \cup \cdots \cup S^{\alpha+\beta+1}) \cdot \operatorname{Dec}_S$.

Horizontal Presburger-Definable Relations

Definition

A relation $S \subseteq \mathbb{N} \times \mathbb{N}$ is horizontal if

 $x S y \Rightarrow (x+c) S y$



$$\underbrace{p(0,m) \xrightarrow{\boldsymbol{A}^*R} q(n,0)}_{S_{TR}} \text{ is horizontal}$$

Theorem

Horizontal Presburger-definable relations are effectively closed under union, intersection, composition and transitive closure.

Horizontal Presburger-Definable Relations — Example

$$\begin{array}{ll} x \, S \, y & \stackrel{\mathrm{def}}{\Leftrightarrow} & y \in 2\mathbb{N} \ \land \ y \leq 2x \\ x \, S^+ \, y & \Leftrightarrow & y \in 2\mathbb{N} \ \land \ (x = 0 \Rightarrow y = 0) \end{array}$$





Horizontal Presburger-Definable Relations — Proof

Lemma

If $S \subseteq \mathbb{N} \times \mathbb{N}$ is horizontal then $x S^+ y$ iff there exists z such that

$$z S y \land \forall u \in \{x, \ldots, z-1\}, \exists v > u : u S v$$

Assume
$$x = x_0 S x_1 S \cdots S x_k = y$$
.

If $x_{i-1} \ge x_i$ then $x_{i-1} S x_{i+1}$. So we may suppose w.l.o.g. that

 $x_0 < x_1 < \cdots < x_{k-1}$

Hence $u S x_i$ for all $u \in \{x_{i-1}, \ldots, x_i - 1\}$ and 0 < i < k.

So for all $u \in \{x_0, \ldots, x_{k-1} - 1\}$, there is v > u with u S v.

Take $z = x_{k-1}$.

Horizontal Presburger-Definable Relations — Proof

Lemma

If $S \subseteq \mathbb{N} \times \mathbb{N}$ is horizontal then $x S^+ y$ iff there exists z such that

$$z S y \land \forall u \in \{x, \ldots, z-1\}, \exists v > u : u S v$$

Assume z S y and for all $u \in \{x, \ldots, z - 1\}$, there is v > u with u S v.

If $x \ge z$ then x S y. Otherwise, there exists $x_1 > x$ with $x S x_1$.

Repeat this process to build $x < x_1 < \cdots < x_k$ with $x S x_1 S \cdots S x_k$ and $x_k \ge z$.

Since z S y, we get $x_k S y$.

Shallow Presburger Automata

Definition A Presburger automaton is shallow if every cycle contains only diagonal transitions or an horizontal transition



Theorem

The reachability relation of a shallow Presburger automaton is effectively Presburger-definable.

 $m R_1 n \stackrel{\text{def}}{\Leftrightarrow} s(m) \stackrel{*}{\to} p(n)$ in the Presburger automata without $p \stackrel{H}{\to} q$ R_1, R_2, R_3, R_4 are effectively Presburger-definable by Ind. Hyp. (Removing transitions preserves shallowness.)

By induction on the number of horizontal transitions **Induction step:** pick an horizontal transition $p \xrightarrow{H} q$



 $s(m) \xrightarrow{*} t(n)$ $\Leftrightarrow m R_4 n \lor \exists m', n' : m R_1 m' \land m' ((H \cdot R_2)^* \cdot H) n' \land n' R_3 n$

 $H \cdot R_2$ is horizontal, so $(H \cdot R_2)^*$ is effectively Presburger-definable
