# Vertex-distinguishing edge-coloring

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### Definition - vd-coloring

A vertex-distinguishing edge-coloring (vd-coloring for short) is an edge-coloring

- that is proper: two adjacent edges have distinct colors
- **2** such that, for every pair of vertices u, v, we have  $S(u) \neq S(v)$ , where S(u) denotes the set of colors of the edges incident to u.

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In the following, we consider graphs with at most one isolated vertex and no isolated edges.





#### Definition - observability

The minimum number of colors such that the graph G admits a vd-coloring is called the observability of G and is denoted by Obs(G).



### Conjecture (Burris and Schelp, 1997)

Let G be a graph which contains at most one isolated vertex and which does not contain isolated edges. Consider j the smallest integer such that  $\binom{j}{k} \ge n_k$  (for  $1 \le k \le \Delta$ ), where  $n_k$  denotes the number of vertices of degree k, then Obs(G) = j or j + 1.

TRUE for differents families of graphs.

# Theorem (Vizing 1964)

 $\chi' \leq \Delta + 1.$ 

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Conjecture (weak List Coloring Conjecture 1976)

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Conjecture (Zhang, Liu and Wang, 2002)

For connected graphs on at least 6 vertices,  $\chi'_{avd} \leq \Delta + 2$ .

## Theorem (Zhang, Liu and Wang, 2002)

For cycle  $C_p$ , we have :

$$\chi'_{avd}(C_p) = \begin{cases} 3 & if \ p \equiv 0 \pmod{3} \\ 4 & if \ p \not\equiv 0 \pmod{3} \text{ and } p \neq 5 \\ 5 & if \ p = 5 \end{cases}$$

#### Theorem (Hatami, 2005)

Every graph with maximum degree  $\Delta$  and with no isolated edges has an avd-coloring with at most  $\Delta$  + 300 colors, provided that  $\Delta$  > 10<sup>20</sup>.

### ${\sf Definition}\ -\ {\rm mad}$

The maximum average degree of a graph G, denoted mad(G), is the maximum of the average degrees of all the subgraphs of G:

$$\mathrm{mad}(\mathsf{G}) = \max\left\{rac{2|\mathsf{E}(\mathsf{H})|}{|\mathsf{V}(\mathsf{H})|}, \mathsf{H}\subseteq\mathsf{G}
ight\}$$

## Theorem (Wang and Wang, 2010)

Let G be a graph with maximum degree  $\Delta(G)$  and maximum average degree mad(G).

• If mad(G) < 3 and  $\Delta(G) \ge 3$ , then  $\chi'_{avd}(G) \le \Delta(G) + 2$ .

2 If 
$$mad(G) < \frac{5}{2}$$
 and  $\Delta(G) \ge 4$ , or  $mad(G) < \frac{7}{3}$  and  $\Delta(G) = 3$ , then  $\chi'_{avd}(G) \le \Delta(G) + 1$ .

## [Wang and Wang, 2010]

- If  $mad(G) < \frac{7}{3}$  and  $\Delta(G) = 3$ , then  $\chi'_{avd}(G) \le \Delta(G) + 1$ .
- If  $\operatorname{mad}(G) < \frac{5}{2}$  and  $\Delta(G) \geq 4$ , then  $\chi'_{\operatorname{avd}}(G) \leq \Delta(G) + 1$ .

### Theorem (H. and Montassier, 2011)

If  $mad(G) < 3 - \frac{2}{\Delta(G)}$  and  $\Delta(G) \ge 5$ , then  $\chi'_{avd}(G) \le \Delta(G) + 1$ .

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# Our results with M. Bonamy and N. Bousquet



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Theorem (Bonamy, Bousquet and H., 2013)

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A graph G with  $\Delta = 3$  and  $mad = \frac{11}{4} < 3$  such that  $\chi'_{avd} = 5$ .

## Theorem (Edwards, Horňák and Woźniak, 2006)

For every bipartite planar graph with  $\Delta \ge 12$ ,  $\chi'_{avd} \le \Delta + 1$ .

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# Our result with M. Bonamy and N. Bousquet

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#### Theorem (Bonamy, Bousquet and H., 2013)

Let  $k \ge 12$ . For every planar graph with  $\Delta \le k$ ,  $\chi'_{avd} \le k+1$ . Let G be a minimum counterexample to the theorem.

- **(**) Study the structural properties of G
- **2** Reach a contradiction using a discharging method on G
#### Key Claim

In G, a vertex v with  $d(v) \le 6$  has at most one neighbor w with  $d(w) \le 6$ , and then d(w) = d(v).

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#### In other words

A small vertex is adjacent to at most one small vertex.

# Key Lemma



# Key Lemma



A vertex v s.t.  $7 \le d(v) \le 12$  has few small neighbors.

- **1** A weight function  $\omega$ .
- **②** Discharging rules... [Redistribute weights accordingly. Once the discharging is finished, a new weight function  $\omega^*$  is produced.]
- Using Euler's formula and the discharging technique we will derive a contradiction.

By Euler's Formula we have:

$$|V| - |E| + |F| = 2$$

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$$6|E| - 6|V| - 6|F| = -12$$

$$2|E| - 6|V| + 4|E| - 6|F| = -12$$

$$\sum_{f\in F(G)} d(f) = \sum_{v\in V(G)} d(v) = 2|E|$$

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Conclusion:

$$\omega(x) = d(x) - 6 \text{ if } x \in V(G)$$

$$\omega(x) = 2d(x) - 6 \text{ if } x \in F(G)$$

### $\omega(f) \geq 0$

$$\omega(v) = d(v) - 6 < 0 \iff d(v) \le 5$$

When the discharging procedure is achieved, we proved that:

The total sum of weights is not changed.

3 For all 
$$x \in V(G) \cup F(G), \ \omega^*(x) \ge 0.$$

Hence,

$$0 \le \sum_{x \in V(G) \cup F(G)} \omega^*(x) = \sum_{x \in V(G) \cup F(G)} \omega(x) = -12 < 0$$

then, no such counterexample can exist.

Theorem (Bonamy, Bousquet and H., 2013)

Let  $k \ge 4$ . Then  $\Delta \le k$ , mad  $< 3 \Rightarrow \chi'_{avd} \le k+1$ .

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$$M^{-}$$
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In a minimal counter-example, there is no:

• Vertex adjacent to many vertices of degree 1.

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Theorem (Woodall, 2010)

 $\forall m \geq 2$ , mad  $\langle m, \Delta \geq 2 \times m^2 \Rightarrow \chi'_{\ell} = \Delta$ .

Theorem (Borodin, Kostochka and Woodall, 1997)

Any bipartite multigraph G is L-edge-colorable if  $\forall (u, v) \in E(G), |L(u, v)| \ge max(d(u), d(v)).$ 

$$m^{-} \longrightarrow (2m-1)^{-}$$

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$$|\{\textcircled{m}^{-}\}| \leq m \times |\{\textcircled{M}^{+}\}|.$$

- (R1) Every vertex of degree at least  $\frac{k}{2}$  gives  $\sum_{i=2}^{m-1} 2(2i-3)$  to the bank.
- (R2) Every vertex u such that  $\frac{m}{2} \le d(u) < m$  receives m d(u) from the bank.
- (R3) Every vertex u such that  $d(u) < \frac{m}{2}$  receives d(u) from the bank.

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A NSD *k*-coloring of a graph *G* is

- **(**) a proper edge coloring of G using at most k colors and
- **2** for every pair of **adjacent** vertices  $u, v, s(u) \neq s(v)$ , where s(u) is the sum of colors taken on the edges incident with u.



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#### Definition - nsd-chromatic index

 $\chi'_{\Sigma}(G)$ : smallest integer k s.t. G admits a NSD k-coloring.

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- Solution of adjacent vertices u, v, s(u) ≠ s(v), where s(u) is the sum of colors taken on the edges incident with u.



$$\chi'_{\Sigma}(G) = 4$$

#### Definition - nsd-chromatic index

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#### Conjecture (Flandrin et al., 2013)

If G is a connected graph of order at least three different from the cycle C<sub>5</sub>, then  $\chi'_{\Sigma}(G) \leq \Delta(G) + 2$ .
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#### Theorem (Bonamy and Przybyło, 2014)

Any planar graph G with  $\Delta(G) \ge 28$  and with no isolated edges satisfies  $\chi'_{\Sigma}(G) \le \Delta(G) + 1$ .

### Theorem (Dong et al., 2014)

Any graph G with no isolated edges,  $\Delta(G) \ge 6$  and  $\operatorname{mad}(G) < \frac{5}{2}$  satisfies  $\chi'_{\Sigma}(G) \le \Delta(G) + 1$ .

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#### Theorem (Hu et al., 2015)

Any graph G with no isolated edges,  $\Delta(G) \ge 6$  and  $\operatorname{mad}(G) < \frac{8}{3}$  satisfies  $\chi'_{\Sigma}(G) \le \Delta(G) + 1$ .

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#### Theorem (Yu *et al.*, 2016)

Any graph G with no isolated edges,  $\Delta(G) \ge 5$  and mad(G) < 3 satisfies  $\chi'_{\Sigma}(G) \le \Delta(G) + 2$ .

- Any graph G with no isolated edges,  $\Delta(G) \ge 6$  and  $mad(G) < \frac{5}{2}$  satisfies  $\chi'_{\Sigma}(G) \le \Delta(G) + 1$ . [Dong *et al.*, 2014]
- Any graph G with no isolated edges,  $\Delta(G) \ge 6$  and  $\operatorname{mad}(G) < \frac{8}{3}$  satisfies  $\chi'_{\Sigma}(G) \le \Delta(G) + 1$ . [Hu *et al.*, 2015]
- Any graph G with no isolated edges,  $\Delta(G) \ge 5$  and mad(G) < 3 satisfies  $\chi'_{\Sigma}(G) \le \Delta(G) + 2$ . [Yu *et al.*, 2016]

#### Theorem (H. and Przybyło, 2016)

Any graph G with no isolated edges,  $\Delta(G) \ge 6$  and mad(G) < 3 satisfies  $\chi'_{\Sigma}(G) \le \Delta(G) + 1$ .

Fix an integer  $k \ge 6$ . Suppose that H is a minimal graph without isolated edges such that  $\Delta(H) \le k$ , mad(H) < 3 and  $\chi'_{\Sigma}(H) > k + 1$ .

- **1** Study the structural properties of *H*.
- **2** Reach a contradiction using a discharging method on H.

### Key Lemma

For any finite sets  $L_1, \ldots, L_n$  of real numbers with  $|L_i| \ge n$  for  $i = 1, \ldots, n$ , the set

$$\{x_1 + \ldots + x_t : x_1 \in L_1, \ldots, x_n \in L_n; x_i \neq x_j \text{ for } i \neq j\}$$

contains at least  $\sum_{i=1}^{n} |L_i| - n^2 + 1$  distinct elements.
