2. (a) You maneuver a spaceship in a three dimensional space. At time t the position of the spaceship is given by the vector ⟨x(t), y(t), z(t)⟩. A proton star at the origin emits radiation in such a way that the perceived radiation at a point in space is given by the equation R(x, y, z) = e^{-(x²+y²+z²)}. Assume that at time t = 0 the position of the spaceship is ⟨x(0), y(0), z(0)⟩ = ⟨1, 1, 1⟩ and that its velocity is ⟨x'(0), y'(0), z'(0)⟩ = ⟨1, 2, -4⟩. Determine the rate of change of the perceived radiation by the spaceship at time t = 0.

(b) (Bonus marks) Construct an example of a function f(x, y) such that every level curve is a single line of the form c = 2x + y for some $c \in \mathbb{R}$ but whose graph is NOT a plane.
