They pace the diameter and find it to be d = 10 paces plus or minus 2 paces (they're not great at counting). The goats know that area is proportional to radius squared; thus they have derived the area formula  $A = pr^2$ . Goats don't know about " $\pi$ " but they have experimentally determined that p = 3 plus or minus 0.5.

7. (a) Let E be the region of  $\mathbb{R}^3$  where  $x^2 + y^2 + z^2 \leq 1$ ,  $x \geq 0$ ,  $y \geq 0$ , and  $z \geq 0$ . Write the region in spherical coordinates. 6 marks

Write an integral for the total amount of grass contained on the surface above a region D of the xy-plane. Hint: in a small patch, the amount of grass depends both on the density and the area of the patch.
